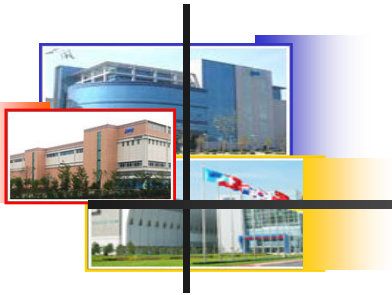
# SAFE HARBOR

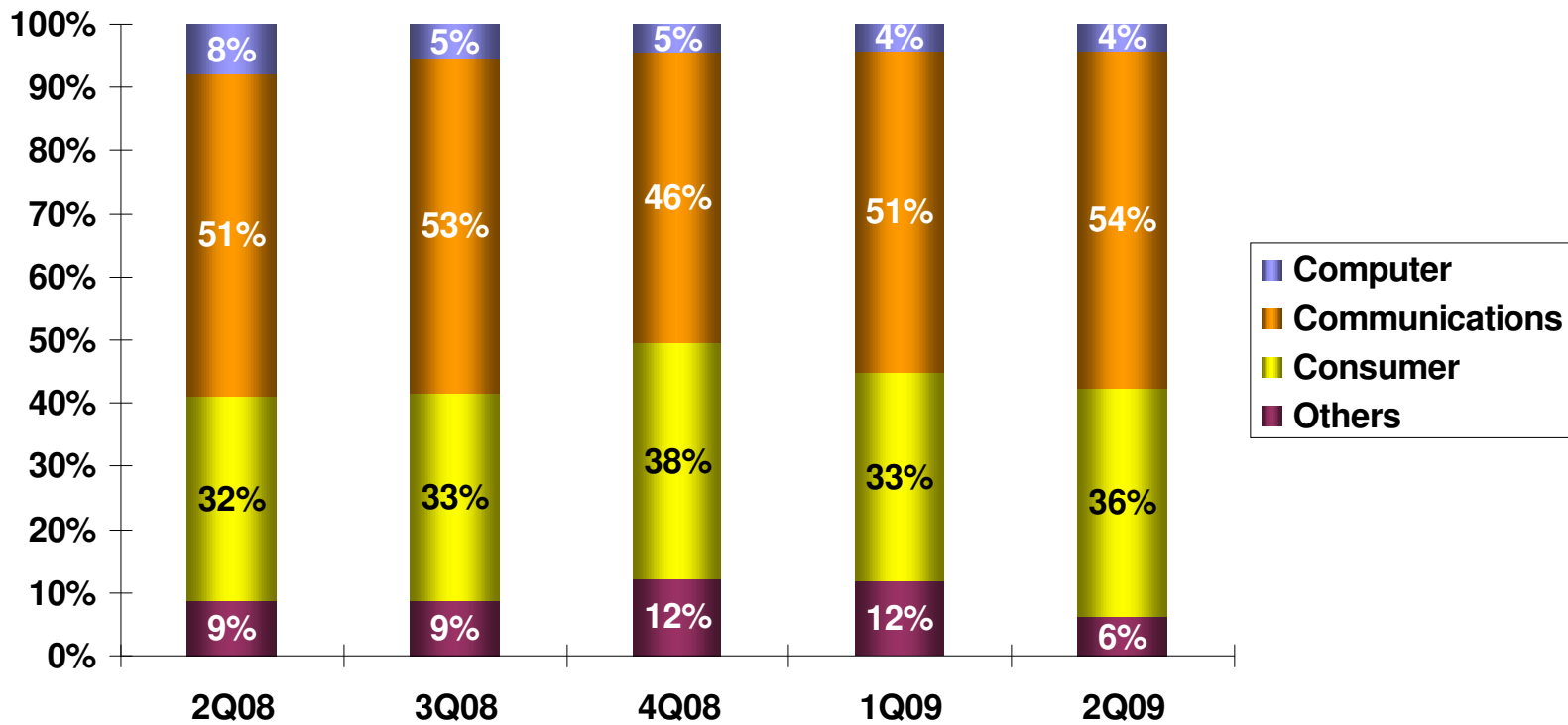

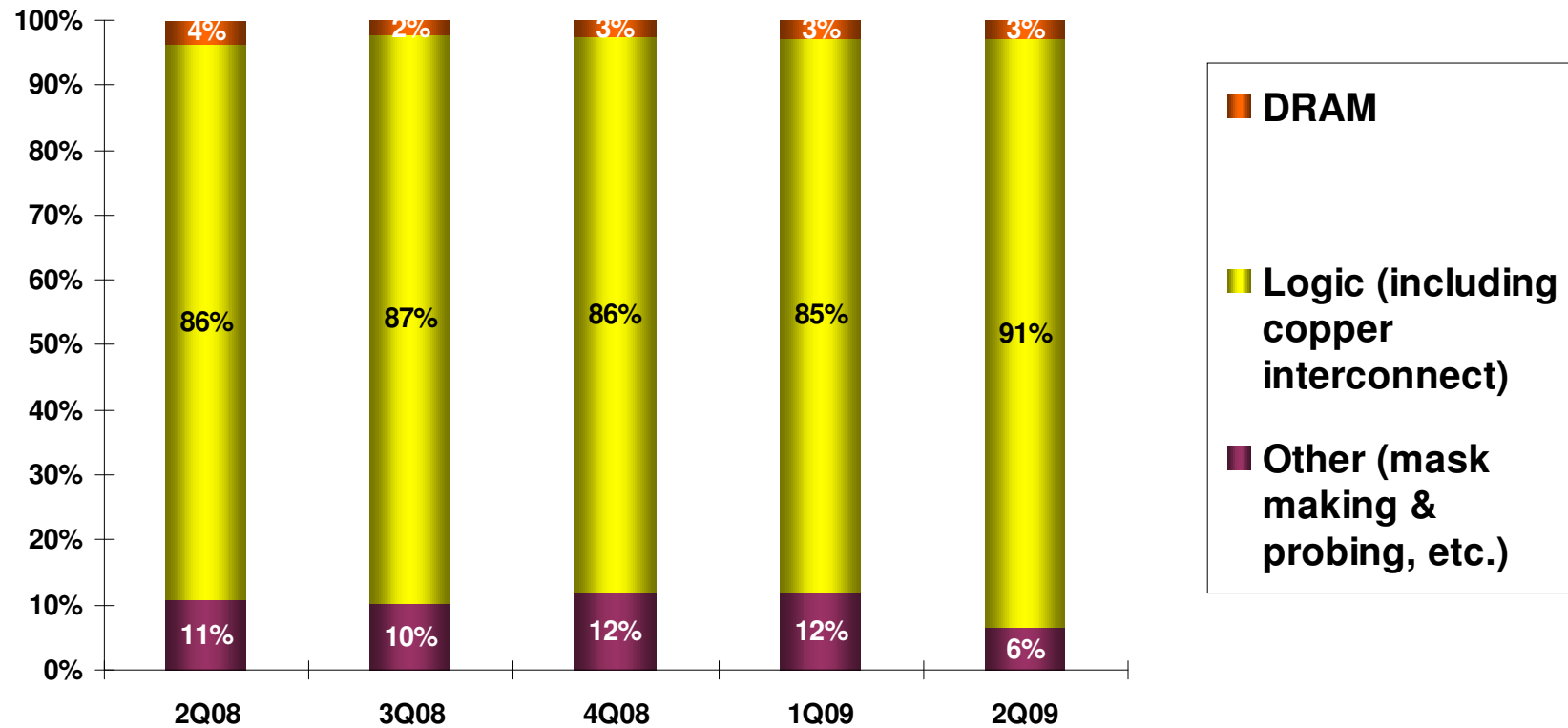
# SALES BREAKDOWN BY APPLICATION

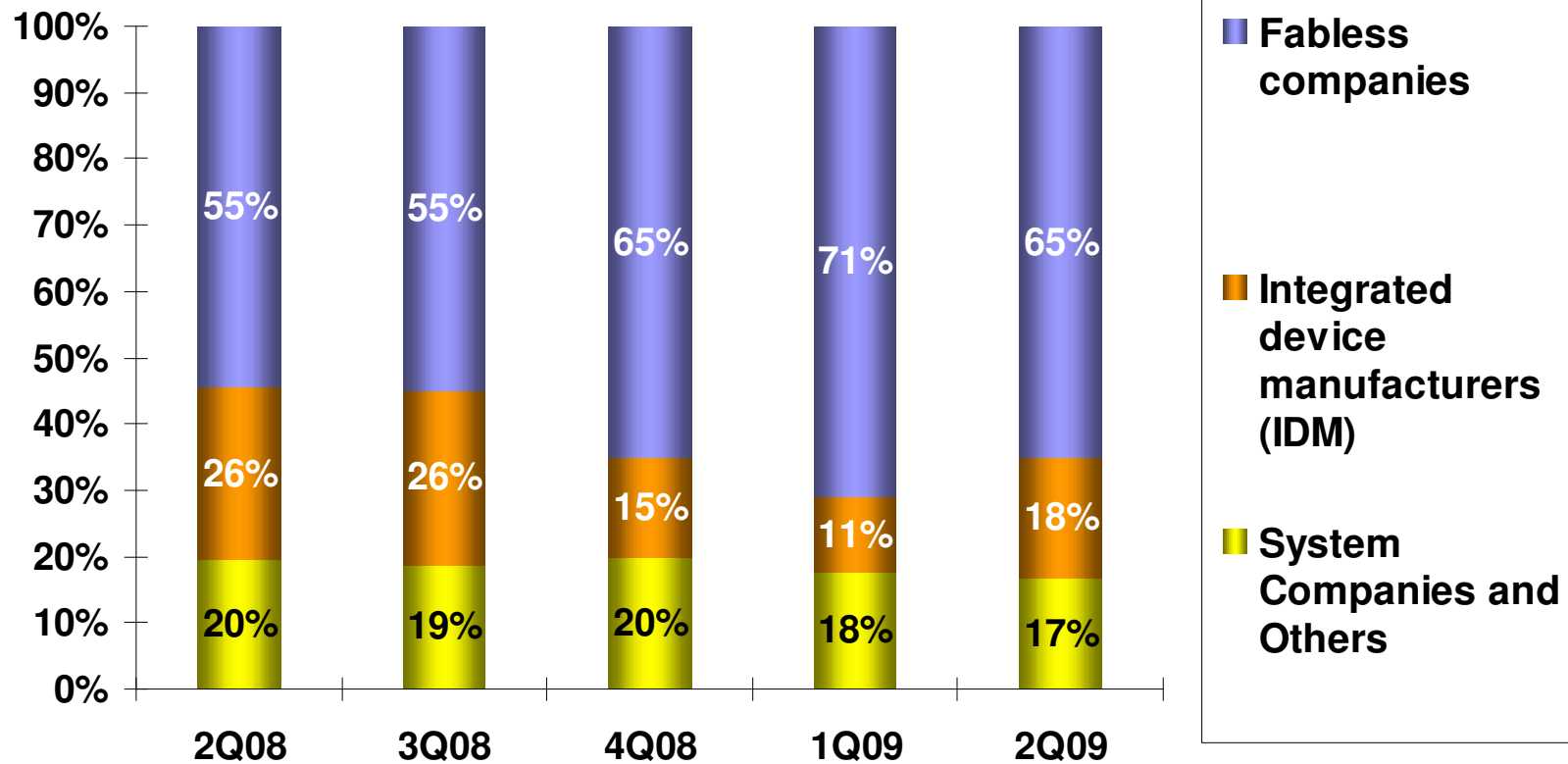
# SALES BREAKDOWN BY SERVICES



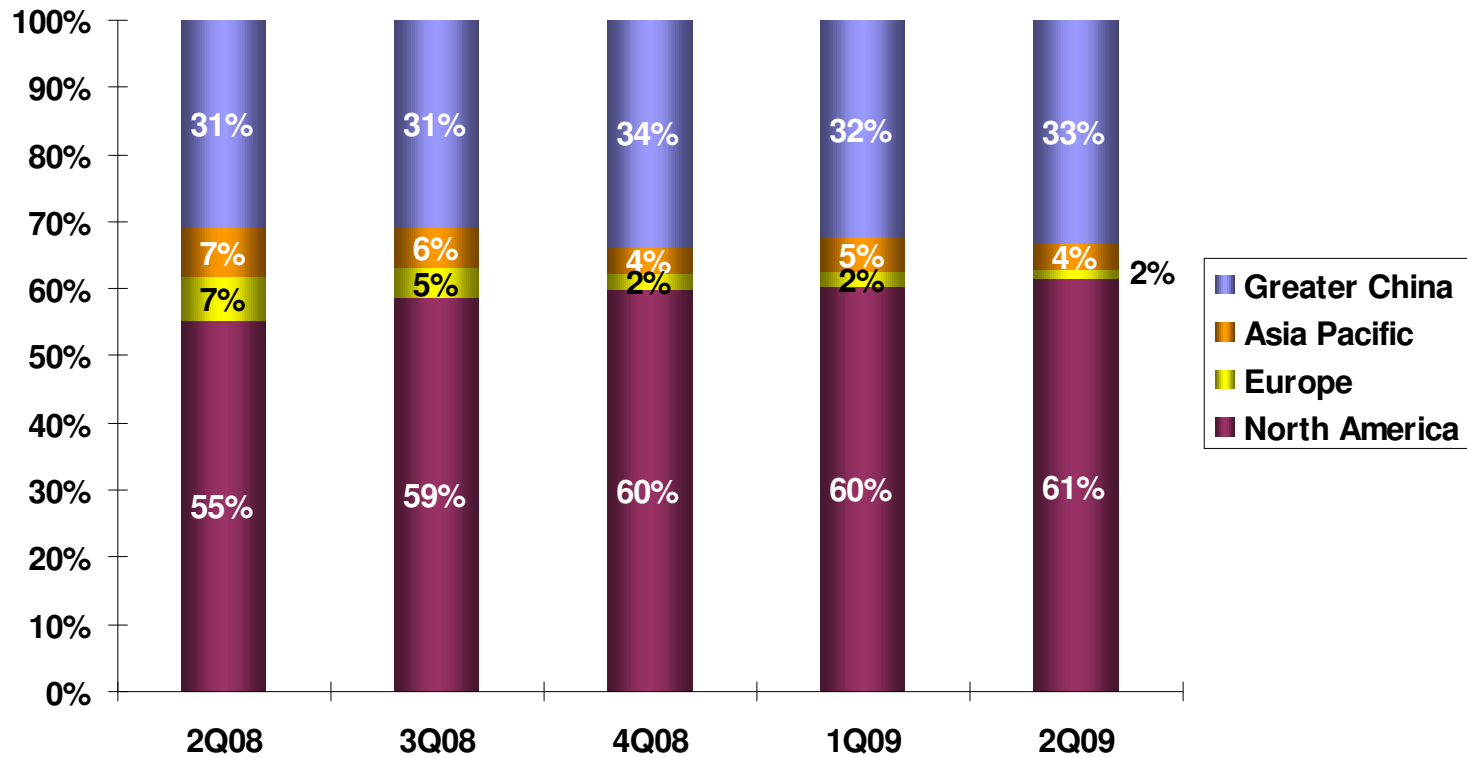

# SALES BREAKDOWN BY GEOGRAPHY

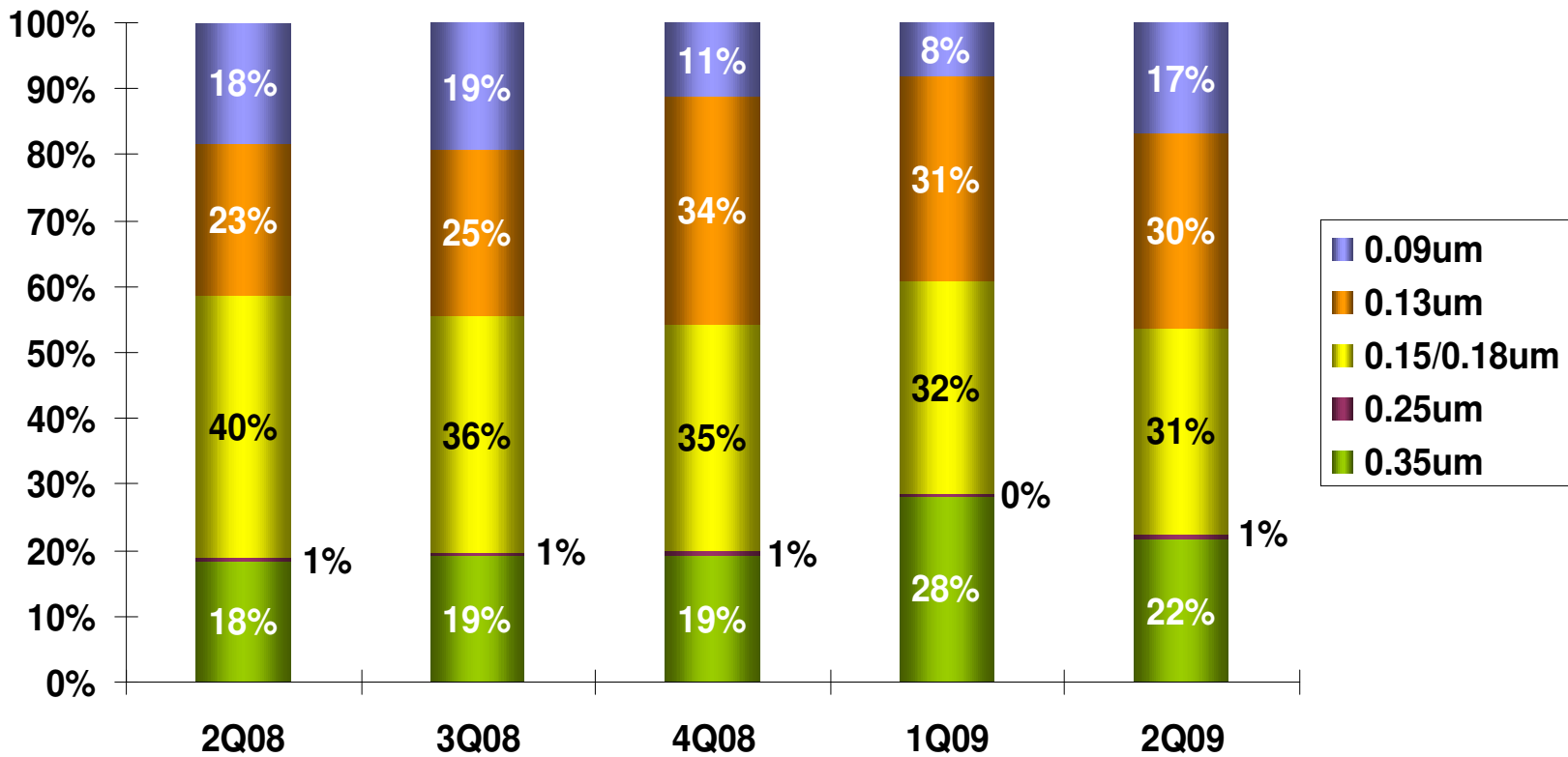
